How Does the South Caucasus Compare?

CRRC's report "How Does the South Caucasus Compare?" aims to put attitudes towards gender in Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia, the three countries of the South Caucasus region, into a global context. Comparing data from the Pew Research Center's Global Attitudes Project 2010 with that of the CRRC's Caucasus Barometer (CB), the report shows that on several crucial questions of gender equality, there are significant cleavages between the South Caucasus neighbors. Armenian Media Landscape - CRRC's Upcoming Report

CRRC will shortly release a report on the "Armenian Media Landscape," that aims to provide a broader understanding of Armenian media, as well as its use and attitudes and perceptions towards it. Based on a comprehensive survey of the Armenian population and eight complementary focus group discussions conducted in 2011, the project provides in-depth data on trust in the media, attitudes towards media freedom and news consumption. The research also provides a thorough investigation of media outlet ownership and use of various media technologies, including TV, radio, mobile phones, computers and the internet.
